This court contains 2 models, dressed in the uniforms of nurses of the Timaru Public Hospital

DRAWING ROOM:

1st Model: Is wearing the uniform as worn in the 1860's.
A long black frock, with lace collar and white apron worn over it, with a wide black belt with silver buckle, a lace cap is worn on the head.

2nd Model: Is wearing a white smock, white veils shoes and stockings.

The nurse of the early day lived in a restricted area, cooking, scrubbing and caring for her patients, unable to see the sights of the world. Now, with training in all branches of nursing she is able to travel the pathways of the world for distance is no bar.

The poster showing Public Health and District Nurses' means of travel shows that they have improved with the times; with more patients to attend to it was necessary for the nurses to travel about more quickly.

With improved health services the infant mortality rate in New Zealand declined rapidly as the graph shows at a glance.

The photos of the Public Hospital show how it has expanded over the years. The establishment of cottage hospitals throughout South Canterbury has meant better services to the people who live in those areas.

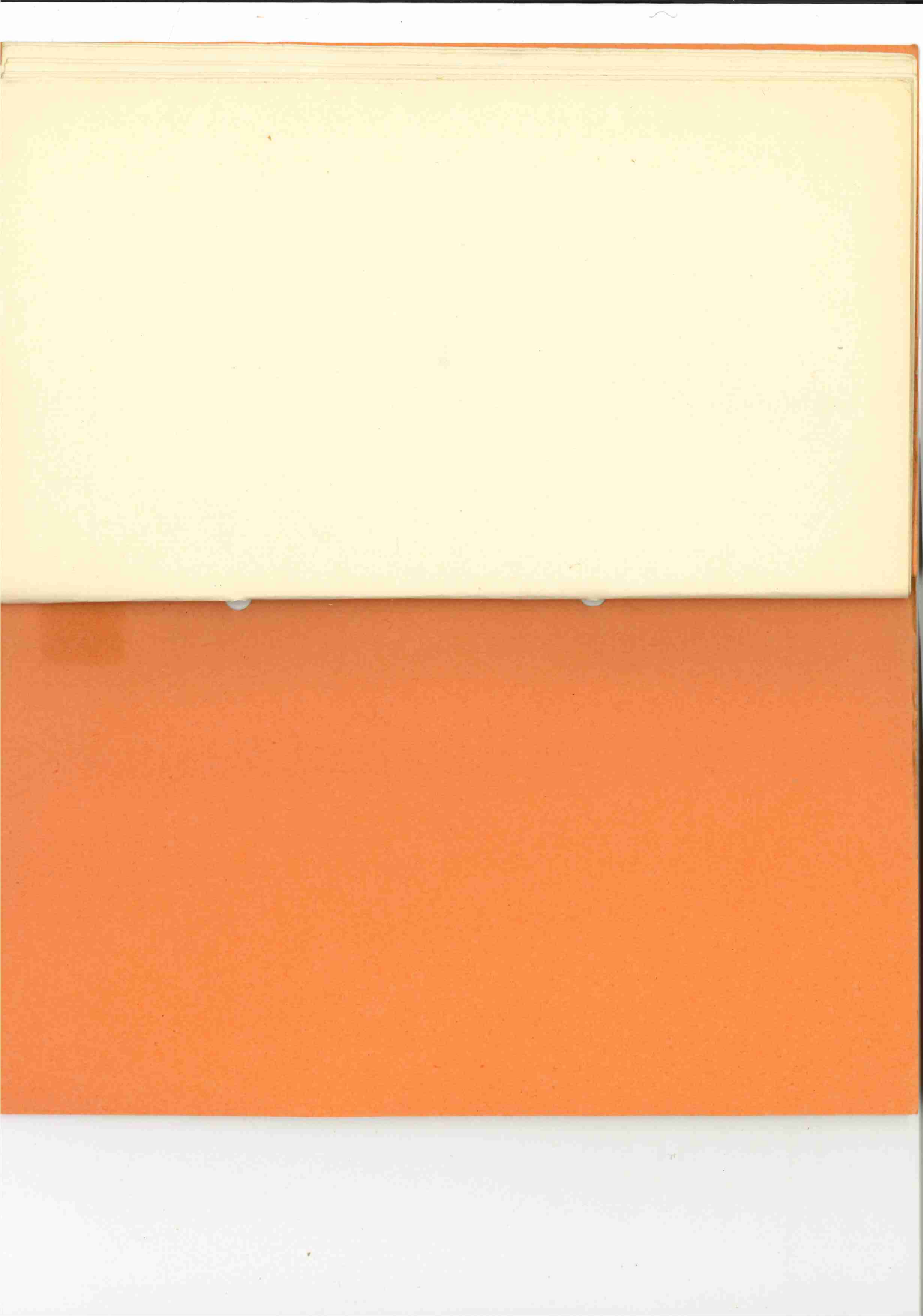
